Concept Note

The protection of a nation and its citizens from various threats and coercion is referred to as "national security." Formalizing a national security strategy may be difficult due to the complexity of a strategy to address national security issues in a situation that is rapidly changing on a national and global level. A well-defined national security strategy, however, also paints a clear picture of the course that a nation should take to protect its national interests.

Although there are some national security regulations, India oddly lacks a national security policy and strategy to give our national security perspectives a clear direction. Given its emergence as a regional power, India continues to face a myriad of traditional and non-traditional threats and challenges to its national security. The expanse of conventional and non-conventional national security issues is considerable. As a result, the effort would be to concentrate on those conventional and unconventional threats and challenges that directly affect our national security. It is necessary to examine the global strategic environment to find solutions to the short- and long-term views of national security concerns. India has been operating in a challenging strategic environment, where close rivals have enormous resources and rapidly modernizing militaries.
